Dress Code - Grade 6, 7 & 8

Students may NOT wear:

- Any articles of clothing in which <u>any</u> underwear is visible
- Tank tops with spaghetti straps. Straps on all tops must be at least 'two fingers' wide
- · Halter tops or tops with bare midriffs
- Mesh clothing in which a student's chest or lower body parts are visible
- Undershirts that are similar to a tank top
- Shirts depicting alcohol, drugs, sexual matter, profanity, violence, tobacco products
- Pants that are sagging so low that underwear is visible
- Heavy metal chains, even as part of a wallet
- Bracelets, necklaces, rings or earrings with spikes on them
